

Season of Style Candy Bar Slider

Supplies:

Tag It Stamp Set (item 130300/130303)
Cherry Cobbler Classic Ink (item 126966)
Old Olive Classic Ink (item 126953)
Basic Black Stampin' Write Marker

Blushing Bride Stampin' Write Marker

Simply Scored Scoring Tool (item 122334)
Sticky Strip (item 104294)

Magnetic Platform (item 130658)

Chocolate Chip Card Stock (item 102128): 6 3/4" x 6 1/2", scored at 1/2" and 3 5/8"

Old Olive Card Stock (item 100702): 2 3/4" x 6 1/4"

Season of Style Designer Series Paper (item 132340): 2 1/2" x 6"

Whisper White Card Stock (item 100730): 2 1/2" x 3 1/2" (cut 2)

Cherry Cobbler 1/2" Seam Binding (item 120992): about 30"

1. Lay Chocolate Chip Card Stock on the Simply Scored Scoring Tool with the 6 3/4" along the top and score at 1/2" and 3 5/8". (See my Halloween Candy Bar Slider Video Tutorial for detailed instructions.)
2. Fold on score lines and add a piece of Sticky Strip to the 1/2" section. Fold over and adhere.
3. Stamp "Santa image" from the Tag It stamp set onto Whisper White Card Stock in Old Olive and then again in Cherry Cobbler Classic Ink.
4. Run the Old Olive image through the Big Shot using the Magnetic Platform and the Chalk Talk Framelits.
5. Cutting along the lines, cut the square "Santa image" from the Cherry Cobbler image. Use your Basic Black and Blushing Bride Stampin' Write Markers to add color to face and boots. Adhere to the top of the Old Olive piece. Add Dazzling Details to Santa's suit, set aside to dry well.
6. Adhere Old Olive Card Stock to the front of Chocolate Chip slider.
7. Layer the Season of Style Designer Series Paper to the top of Old Olive piece.
8. Attach your layered "Santa Image" using Dimensionals.
9. Using a Crop-a-dile punch a 3/8" hole in the top of the base.
10. Take a piece of Cherry Cobbler 1/2" Seam Binding and run it through both holes.
11. Place your candy bar into the slider, pushing the ribbon down as you go. Tie ribbon into a bow and trim ends.
