Crushed Curry Card stock: Cut 8 1/2" x 5 1/2"; scored at 5 1/2"

Merry Merlot Card stock: Cut 5 1/4" x 4"

Very Vanilla Card stock: Cut 5" x 3 3/4"

Very Vanilla Card stock: Cut 4" x 5 1/4"

Holiday Basic Rhinestones: 5-7 assorted

Assembly:

1. Using your Grid Paper apply sticky notes so that they cover a ½ inch of the left edge of the Very Vanilla panel.
2. Count over 1 ¾ inches and leave a gap of Very Vanilla Card stock showing and apply a second sticky note to protect the right edge of panel.
3. Create a faux layer by sponging the Crushed Curry, Cajun Craze, and Merry Merlot Classic Inks onto Very Vanilla card stock between the sticky notes.
4. Remove your sticky notes.
5. Stamp “It’s your day” sentiment using Early Espresso Classic Ink.
6. Stamp leaf image using Early Espresso Classic Ink randomly.
7. Finally stamp the dots image using Early Espresso Classic Ink randomly around the leaves.
8. Adhere the Merry Merlot Card stock piece to the card front.
9. Add Stampin’ Dimensionals to the back of the stamped panel and adhere to the card front.
10. Place 3-7 assorted Holiday Basic Rhinestones around the card front as desired. (I used the Cherry Cobbler Rhinestones).
11. Stamp the Very Vanilla card stock inside panel as desired and add it to the inside of your card.
12. Stamp envelope as desired.

Tip: It is always a good idea to start with the lighter color first when sponging to help prevent transferring color from ink pad to ink pad.
